QUALITY MANAGEMENT IN TEACHING AT **RUHR UNIVERSITY**

The quality management system at Ruhr University Bochum is a system that has evolved over time. Since the introduction of the student monitor with its study entry and study progess survey and the university's participation in the graduate study cooperation project, these core instruments have becoteaching report as a self-assessment by the faculties.

The process of teaching reporting at RUB is a data-based development context of teaching reports and dialogue. Faculties, the central university commission for teaching faculties, often across subject group and the rectorate engage in dialogue, classify results, development goals, strengths and weaknesses of the faculties and use this information to develop common goals, which become binding within the framework of perspective agreements

between the rectorate and the faculty/ZWE.

Ruhr University is particularly proud of the fact that this process is generally conducted in an extremely collegial atmosphere and with great openness—also and especially with regard to weaknesses. At the me increasingly integrated with the same time, each round of teaching reports represents a collection of good and transferable problemsolving approaches. In this way, best practices are identified in the immediately passed on to other boundaries.
